
L.E.D Awning Lamp

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS


- Remove white casing from lamp assembly by unclipping from the points (diagram 1).
- Drill a 10mm pilot hole to suit the cable exit.
- Drill 2 x 3mm pilot hole to suit screws.
- Install screws or rivets and secure base to mounting surface (diagram 2).
- Clip white cover back onto base.

PIR (Passive Infrared) Sensor Adjustment (P/No. 87788 only)

The PIR will activate the lamp when it senses movement within a 3 metre radius from the sensor. The PIR function can be adjusted to maintain lamp illumination between 1 sec & 1 min using the dial on the base of the unit (diagram 3).

Note: PIR sensor will only activate lamp in dark conditions.










WIRING INSTRUCTIONS (P/No. 87780, 87780BL, 87786)

Red: Positive (+)
Black: Negative (-)
White (PIR): Positive (+)



3 Way Switch Wiring Option:

When wiring the PIR Awning Lamp (P/No. 87788) a 3 way switch can be used to allow the lamp to be turned on/off permanently. As well as switching the PIR function on separately, the lamp will then only illuminate when the PIR sensor is activated.

Note: The following Narva 3 way switches are suitable for this type of application: 62011BL, 63041BL (Rocker Switches) & 60061BL (Toggle Switch).
